A Diocesan Farewell to Bishop Nick Baines



Safeguarding Sunday: Action Speaks Louder

Now in its seventh year, Safeguarding Sunday is a powerful opportunity for churches of all sizes and denominations to pause, reflect, and take meaningful action to create safer communities for all. This year's campaign theme — *Action Speaks Louder* — urges us to take concrete steps to improve safeguarding in our community.



St Peter's Parochial Church Council (PCC) adopted the policy statement 'Promoting a Safer Church' in 2019. It sets out the safeguarding children, young people and vulnerable adult's policy of the Church of England and can be <u>downloaded on our website</u>. The policy is reviewed by the PCC every year.


The PCC appointed Wendy Lewis (*pictured*) as our Parish Safeguarding Officer in January 2025. Her role is to advise on and coordinate safeguarding across St Peter's in conjunction with the Diocesan Safeguarding Team (DSA). They offer

16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence

The United Nation's 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence are held annually between 25th November and 10th December.

This year Ripon Cathedral will mark the 16 Days with a special exhibition of artwork originally commissioned for White Ribbon UK, working with male prisoners at HMP Hull. White Ribbon UK is a charity that works to end men's violence against women and girls, by challenging harmful ideas about gender that lead to inequality and abuse.

After Evensong on Tuesday 25th November, which will be led by the Bishop of Ripon, Anna Eltringham, the art exhibition will be launched with a reception and guest speakers. On Saturday 6th December at 10:00 am there will be a **silent vigil** in solidarity with all those affected by gender-based violence outside the West Door of the Cathedral, followed by a **Service of Lament and Hope**, led by Bishop Anna and hosted by *The Mother's Union*. All are welcome to come and stand with those impacted by gender-based violence within our communities and across the globe.


