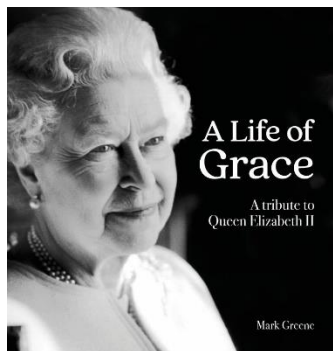

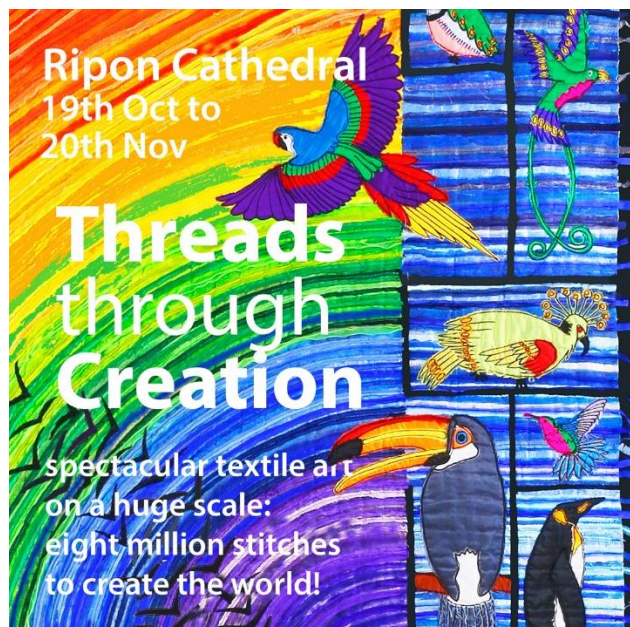

Threads through Creation

Do you remember the amazing 'Threads through Revelation' exhibition at Ripon Cathedral? It was the work of textile artist Jacqui Wilson. She has followed that up with 'Threads through Creation', which is set to visit twenty cathedrals in 2021 - 2024. The twelve huge textile panels retelling the Genesis story in the first pages of the Bible will be exhibited at Ripon Cathedral from 19th October until 20th November. Admission is free, but donations to the work of the Cathedral are always welcome.
