The long-awaited concert postponed from April 2020.

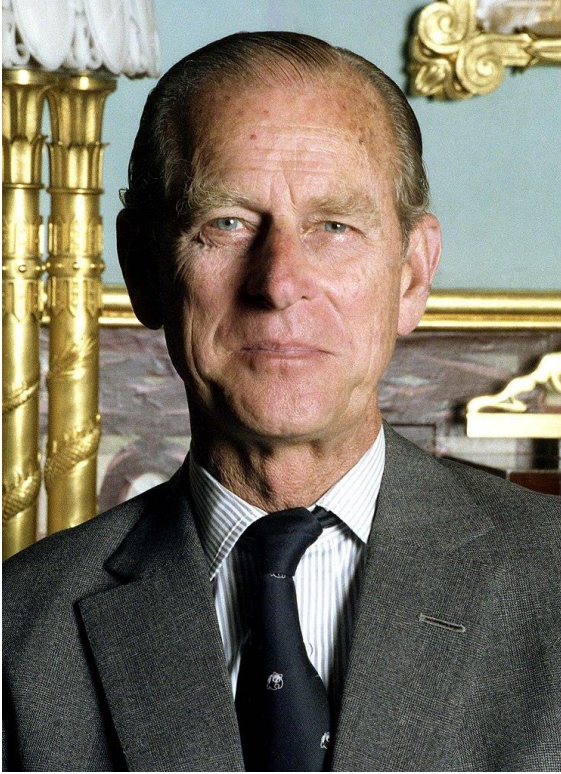
St Peter's Players present *Oliver!* from 4th – 6th November

Condolence book for HRH Prince Philip, The Duke of Edinburgh



The Church of England has opened an online condolence book following the announcement from Buckingham Palace of the death of HRH Prince Philip, The Duke of Edinburgh. The book is open to any individual or church communities who wish to sign and record a message.

In a statement The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, said:

I join with the rest of the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth in mourning the loss of His Royal Highness Prince Philip, The Duke of Edinburgh, and give thanks to God for his extraordinary life of dedicated service. Prince Philip continually demonstrated his unfailing support and unstinting loyalty to Her Majesty The Queen for 73 years.

He consistently put the interests of others ahead of his own and, in so doing, provided an outstanding example of Christian service. During his naval career, in which he served with distinction in the Second World War, he won the respect of his peers as an outstanding officer.

On the occasions when I met him, I was always struck by his obvious joy at life, his enquiring mind and his ability to communicate to people from every background and walk of life. He was a master at putting people at their ease and making them feel special.

The legacy he leaves is enormous. The Duke of Edinburgh's Award, which he founded in 1956, has inspired generations of young people to help others and instilled in them a vision for citizenship and a desire to serve their communities. His work with countless charities and organisations reflected his wide-ranging, global interests in topics including wildlife, sport, design, engineering and inter-faith dialogue. In his powerful advocacy for conservation his was a prophetic voice for over half a century, as he brought people from around the world to a new concern and commitment to action for the future of our planet.

As we recover and rebuild after the terrible trial of the coronavirus pandemic, we will need fortitude and a deep sense of commitment to serving others. Throughout his life Prince Philip displayed those qualities in abundance, and I pray that we can take inspiration from his example.

I also join many people in giving thanks for the marriage of Her Majesty the Queen and Prince Philip, and for their children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Theirs was a marriage grounded in friendship and mutual respect and sustained by shared faith in Christ. I pray that God will comfort Her Majesty and the rest of the Royal Family at this time. May His Royal Highness rest in peace and rise in glory.

Christian Aid Week 2021

The focus for Christian Aid Week 2021 is climate justice. The climate crisis is having a significant impact on communities in Kenya – in 2020 drought was followed by relentless rainfall and flooding, which damaged the few crops that had struggled to grow.

Rose is a grandmother, who lives in Kitui, eastern Kenya, and is caught in this cycle of climate chaos. When she was a child, Rose remembers how often the rain would fall, providing plenty of water to grow nutritious food to eat.

Weather extremes are now more frequent and more intense, and without a reliable source of water, many communities are

struggling to survive. The lack of water has made coping with the Coronavirus pandemic even more difficult. This year Christian Aid is raising funds to secure reliable water supplies for people like Rose. You could help by delivering Christian

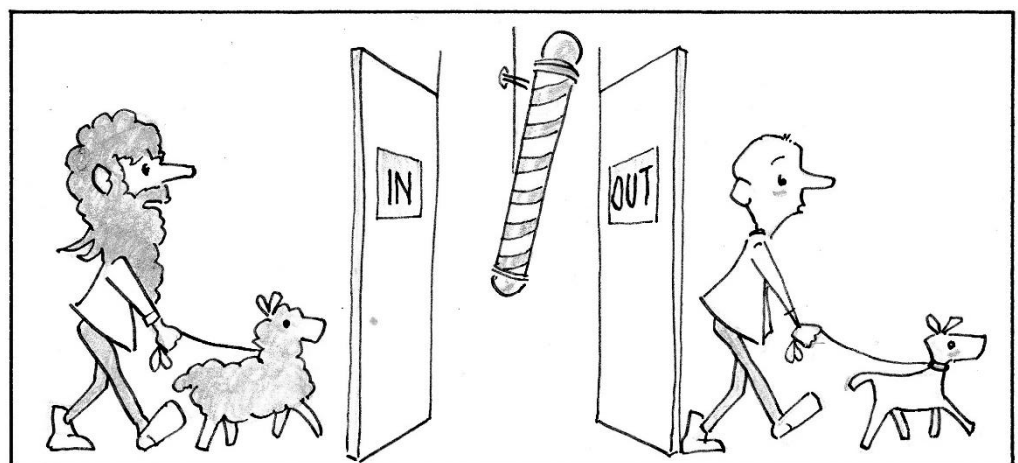
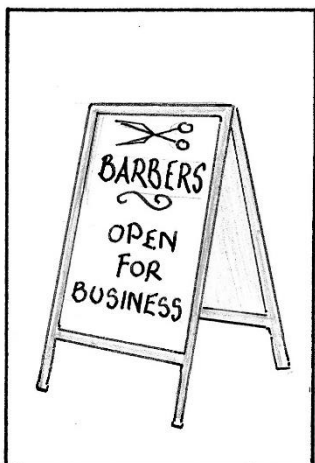
The *Trying Times* book of cartoons raises £2,663
