### The Bereavement Journey course starting in September

We will be running the next course here at St Peter's on Monday evenings from  $16^{th}$  September -  $28^{th}$  October from 6:30 - 8:30 pm in the Brostoff Hall. The course is for anyone who has been bereaved at any time but would value time and a safe space to process their grief. It is a series of films and discussion groups that gently guide participants through the most common aspects of grief and bereavement, enabling them to process the implications for themselves and think about the next steps.

We realise that it won't be easy for you to attend, as coming to something like this is never easy; but we want you to know that we care about all those who do attend, and we do all that we can to make this a safe and good



experience for you. A time where together with like-minded people you can talk about your own grief journey and be listened to – and where like so many others, you'll say at the end that it's been really helpful:

"I entered the course feeling lost, consumed and extremely sad. I have ended the course feeling lighter and more hopeful with a sense of purpose. Grief is a personal journey, but to have people listen, understand and be empathetic has helped me so much."

#### **Repairs to the West Wall**

The PCC has approved the appointment of Graham Bailey as the masonry contractor to undertake the necessary repairs to the West Wall. Graham is recommended by the Church Architect and will be working with Premier Scaffolding.

Graham starts work with us during the week beginning Monday 19<sup>th</sup> August. The external and internal scaffolding will be built during that first week so there could be some disruption to week-day services because of noise. In the case of disruption, we will relocate services to other parts of the building.



We hope this work will be completed speedily but all depends upon what our contractor finds when he examines the masonry. We will keep you posted.

#### A beginner's guide to Evensong: Anthems


The Anglican service of Evensong follows the traditional pattern as written in The Book of Common Prayer of 1549 by Thomas Cranmer, and consists of choral music (the responses, psalms, canticles and **anthems**) from the rich Anglican musical tradition, along with scripture readings, and prayers.

#### Anthems

After the second set of responses, the Book of Common Prayer includes the well-known phrase, 'In Quires and Places where they sing, here followeth the Anthem'. An anthem is a piece of sacred choral music sung by the choir, a setting of a prayer or Biblical text, appropriate to the day or season. Since the services of Matins and Evensong were introduced in the 16<sup>th</sup> century, their constituent parts have been set to music for choirs to sing. Over the centuries a rich musical tradition has developed, with anthems not only being composed by church music composers such as Thomas Tallis and Charles Villiers Stanford, but also by well-known composers of classical music such as Henry Purcell, JS Bach and Mozart.



At the Choral Communion service at St Peter's this evening the anthem is 'Of the glorious body telling' set by the Spanish composer Tomás Luis de Victoria (1548 – 1611). He was a choirboy in Avia Cathedral, an accomplished organist and studied music in Rome. After his ordination, he became chaplain to the Holy Roman Empress Maria in Madrid. The words were written as a hymn by the 13<sup>th</sup> century saint, Thomas Aquinas, for the feast of Corpus Christi, so this anthem is often used at Holy Communion.
