Mourning the death of Queen Elizabeth II

Flags have been flown at half mast, flowers have been laid and bells have been tolled as the country begins to mourn the death of Her Majesty The Queen.

During the national period of mourning St Peter's Church has been open from 9:30 am – 6:30 pm each day for quiet prayer and reflection.




Following the State Funeral, the Coffin will travel in Procession from Westminster Windsor Abbey to Castle. private Α Committal Service will then take place in St George's Chapel, where her father King George VI and her mother, Queen Elizabeth, are buried.



St Peter's Bellringers joined with churches, chapels and cathedrals across the UK in the national tolling of bells at noon on the day after her death was announced.

A Book of Condolence was opened for people to leave their own tributes to The Queen and express their grief.
