## SABIR – Time, Tea and Textiles

Refugee Week is a UK-wide festival celebrating the contributions, creativity and resilience of refugees and people seeking sanctuary. It was founded in 1998 and is held every year around World Refugee Day, which is tomorrow - 20<sup>th</sup> June.

Through a programme of arts, cultural, sports and educational events alongside media and creative campaigns, Refugee Week enables people from different backgrounds to connect beyond labels, as well as encouraging understanding of why people are displaced, and the challenges they face when seeking safety.

Healing is the theme for Refugee Week 2022. This can mean recovering from a painful experience or situation, so that life can continue. No-one understands this better than those who have lost their homes and had to build new lives from scratch. We have much to learn from refugees about holding onto hope when going on seems impossible – as well as about how art, creativity and community can help us to heal. Those going through the asylum system also know that healing is an ongoing process, made harder by poverty, housing difficulties and the threat of being detained or

deported.

This week in the Glass Foyer at St Peter's Church there is an exhibition called **SABIR** – *Time, Tea and Textiles*, by Matilda Velevitch and Kate Dunn, in collaboration with Counterpoints Arts and *Harrogate District of Sanctuary*. This exhibition was especially created for Refugee Week 2022, showcasing artwork made by recently arrived refugees and local residents in Harrogate. Memory maps were made using tea-dyed linen and papers, various threads and inks. Their textile work and personal stories have been curated into hanging tapestries, and combined with work from *Harrogate District of Sanctuary* workshop pieces. Don't miss this.

#### Counter-flow: the movement of cultures from one place to another

As part of our *Come to Know* programme the next exhibition in the Glass Foyer, which starts this Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> June, features three pieces by artist Eva Mileusnic.

The first, *Counter-Flow*, is an installation made from hundreds of beautifully decorated ceramic feet. Eva makes plaster moulds from iron cobbler's lasts once used in the manufacture and repair of shoes. She then uses the moulds to make clay 'feet' which are fired, glazed and then re-fired. Traditional world



textile images are used to decorate the 'feet'. Eva says, "My family has a history of migration and in looking to traditional Hungarian flower motifs I was able to creatively tell the story of my parents Iren and Istvan in a simple, graphic way. And in the case of my husband's Serbian family I again found the inspiration for what I



wanted to achieve in traditional Serbian textile patterns." Next *Inter-National* is a large scale hanging made with a repurposed atlas of the British Isles and images of people wearing their national costume.

And finally *Critical Mass* is also made of foot lasts, but this time in plaster of Paris, and celebrates the diversity of the communities who came to Britain to settle. On Saturday Eva will be holding two free artist's workshops at 11:00 am and 1:00 pm, when you can make and decorate your own pair of plaster cast feet.




