Using devotional digital resources

Using devotional digital resources each day is not about how many apps or podcasts we read or squeeze into the time available. It is about bringing a sacred rhythm into our prayer lives; gleaning greater meaning and understanding from the Bible; interpreting the words and thinking about the impact they might have on our day or week ahead. It is a way of reflecting on psalms, proverbs and verses from the Bible brought to us miraculously each day on our phones, radios or laptops. These resources can be available to us at any time of the day: on the train, on the bus, in the car, while walking or in the gym.

Do you need someone to pray with you?



United Christian Broadcasting (UCB) provides opportunities to hear, watch or read the Bible, with two live radio stations and a catch-up service, playing up-lifting music with lyrics that say just the right thing at the right time. There are podcasts with inspiring interviews, testimonies and biblical teaching; a daily prayer line accessible for anyone to call to ask for prayer; and a daily devotional – *Word for You Today*. UCB is a life line for many, a companion and friend, a provider of peace and joy,

through the busyness of daily life.

Other apps we use for shorter contemplative prayer session are **Our Daily Bread** and **Pray as You Go**. The **Bible In One Year (BIOY),** provides more in-depth commentary and analysis. The prayer apps we use include **Lectio 365** and **First 15**. Finding things to reflect on and share each day with our friends has helped develop and deepen our faith journey - we cannot imagine a day without using them.

Have you seen the new book sharing table?




