Artizan International opens a new café and creative space

Breaking news!! **Artizan International** is excited to announce that we are opening a Café and Creative Space just along the road from St Peter's, next door to Tesco Express. Our fair trade shop on Oxford Street,



**ARTIZAN,** will remain where is it, as since moving into this beautiful building early last year, we've already completely filled it and realised that we will definitely need additional space if we want to run a café as well – which has been part of our vision for a very long time now. It's wonderful to finally be able to bring this to fruition.



The café will provide training and work experience for young adults with learning disabilities, and also visually impaired adults too - who we'll be teaching to make bread. We'll be serving a gorgeous range of fair trade teas, coffees and Peruvian-style hot chocolate, alongside a mouth-watering array of cakes, made by our differently-able trainees. It's a fantastic opportunity to showcase their skills and abilities to the people of Harrogate and encourage local employers to consider taking them on once they have completed 6 - 12 months' training with us. In the creative space we'll be running more

therapeutic crafts workshops for adults and children with disabilities, to increase the range of what we're currently able to offer, plus workshops for the paying public too to help cover some of the running costs of the building.

Right now we're transforming the space from an empty shell to a glorious café, but we'd love to have your help! If you'd like to volunteer with this, or in the future as a helper to support our trainees in the café or kitchen, we'd love to hear from you.

#### Sisters stronger together: united we can save lives



This year the **Christian Aid Harvest Appeal** focuses on Malawi in East Africa - there the combination of gender inequality, energy poverty, financial exclusion and the impacts of climate change makes life especially challenging for rural women. Women face constraints including lack of assets, limited income and restricted access to finance and credit.

To tackle these issues, **Christian Aid** is supporting women to establish their own sustainable energy businesses and promote gender equality through the EU-funded *Breaking the Barriers* programme. Makande Women's Group (*pictured above*) is a Women-Led Sustainable Energy Enterprise (WLSEE) that makes baobab juice.

Baobab is a tree that grows in Africa, Australia, and the Middle East. Every part of the tree has traditionally been used as food, as medicine, or as the basis of clothing or household items. The fruits are about 15 - 20 cm long and hang upside down from the tree and when made into a juice have a citrus flavour.
