## The first day of Advent and of a new church year



Today is the first day of Advent and the beginning of the new Liturgical year – Year C in the three-year cycle of readings. We will be lighting the first candle on our Advent wreath, which is purple and symbolizes **HOPE**. Three of the candles are purple, because it is the liturgical colour for Advent that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. The rose candle symbolizes **JOY** and will be lit on the third Sunday. Our Advent Candle Service starts at 6:30 pm tonight.
