This Harvest, help families feed themselves for the future

At Harvest we celebrate God's gifts, the food we have grown, and the wonderful things we have to eat. Your donations to the **Christian Aid Harvest Appeal** today could help farmers like Jane Paeramanzi from Zimbabwe to grow enough food so that

her family can flourish. This is her story: Mutoko district is a hot, dry drought prone area in the north-east of Zimbabwe, where Jane farms with her family. The climate has become increasingly variable with frequent droughts punctuated by torrential rain.

Christian Aid is the lead partner in a project to diversify incomes and diet and increase resilience. Before the family only grew maize and groundnuts and raised a few indigenous chickens. They never had enough money to buy decent fertiliser and seeds.

Jane's husband put her name down to train as a lead farmer. Jane says, "I was excited to learn all of the new climate smart agriculture techniques and pass the information on to others in my community. We learnt about conservation agriculture, small livestock production, methods of raising improved livestock breeds such as Boschveld chickens

and Boer goats and how to make livestock fodder. After my training I set up demonstrations of all of the different techniques at my home and now I have a group of sixty-five farmers that I train two or three times per month."

Harrogate School of Theology & Mission

Professor Paul Foster, from the School of Divinity at the University of Edinburgh, speaks on 'The Apostolic Fathers: Christianity in the first half of the second century'



During the first and second centuries a group of miscellaneous Christian leaders wrote down their understanding of the meaning of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. They were considered by later Biblical scholars to be the next generation of Apostles and as a result were named The Apostolic Fathers. Their writing contains an essential insight into the development of the early Christian Church.

This rescheduled live lecture is at St Mark's Church on Saturday 7th October, starting with a continental breakfast served from 9:30 am, then the lecture from 10:00 am – 12:00 pm. Tickets still cost only £8 per session (students £5 per session and under 18s free) including breakfast and refreshments. Buy tickets for all four live lectures at a discount of 25% with the <u>HST&M Lecture Season Pass</u>. Fees are payable on the day by contactless card, cheque (payable to Harrogate School of Theology & Mission) or preferably in advance at <u>Eventbrite</u>.
