Covering Alan Garrow's sabbatical has been a deeply enriching experience for me. One of the privileges of being an Associate Vicar is often being able to say, "I'll need to check with Alan about that." Until now, I hadn't fully realised how valuable that support was. When Alan left for his sabbatical, I told myself, 'If the congregation keeps coming and the building stays standing, I'll have done my job.' Well, the building has had its issues, and attendance dipped over the Summer, but thanks to an amazing team, we navigated it all. The building is better than before, and now that the Summer holidays are over, our numbers have actually increased!

One of the biggest lessons I've learned is the importance of focus. St Peter's is a very busy place, and the amount of information I had to absorb was overwhelming at first. Organisation and knowing where to invest my energy have been crucial.

It's a challenging balance between being loving and supportive while upholding the rules, laws that guide our Christian community. I've discovered that, as a leader, you must sometimes make decisions that aren't always appreciated, but are necessary, whatever the personal cost.



Most importantly, I've learned the value of a strong, supportive team and the importance of keeping God at the centre of everything. Leading a church is not just about management; it's about shepherding people toward a deeper relationship with God. Without His vision, it's easy to get lost in all the busyness.

A Saying Goodbye Service at Bradford Cathedral next Sunday

When a baby is lost, whether during pregnancy, at birth, or in infancy, it is a devastating experience for the parents and the extended family. Sadly, for people that lose prior to 24 weeks gestation, services to commemorate the life that has been lost are seldom held, while for parents who lose later in pregnancy, at birth or in early years, the parents are usually in the depths of grief when a service is held.

The *Saying Goodbye* services, a division of the bereavement support charity, The Mariposa Trust, are remembrance services for people who have suffered the loss of a baby at any stage, whether that be recently or decades ago. They provide a time and place for you and your family to acknowledge and remember your baby, whilst collectively 'saying goodbye'. The services also welcome anyone grieving the fact that they have been unable to have children.
