

# Being With – a course exploring Christian faith and life



**Being With** is an invitation to explore the Christian faith with others in an open, positive and inclusive way. It has been designed particularly with those searching the Christian faith for the first time or re-examining their faith after a significant break.

Started as an initiative during lockdown at St Martins-inthe-Field, it was a new way to engage with enquirers. It was found that discovering together through conversation as a group online was a gift rather than a hindrance, so this online format has been adopted for the ten weeks of the course.

The basis of the course is that Christianity is not a message or a set of convictions. As Jesus shows, it is form of а relationship with — God. ourselves, one another and the world. On the course, we take a journey alongside each other, exploring our experience of faith alongside aspects of Christian teaching and together reflecting on how God's Spirit



might already be at work in our everyday lives.



The *Help Yourself Book Table* is here again! It's at the front of Church near the Prayer Tree. Do feel free to browse and take a book home to keep or pass on.


