It has been an extraordinary year for all of us and it is wonderful that you decided to replace your annual Christmas Fair with a Just Giving campaign. We are so thankful for the wonderful gift of £500.



In past years, we have used your gifts from the Christmas Fair for our ministry in Rwanda. This year we are suggesting that we use your Christmas gift for our work in Burundi which is located immediately south of Rwanda. western border of Burundi is the magnificent Lake Tanganyika. Over the have years we supported various projects through our partner REMA Burundi including peace making initiatives, the distribution of Bibles and




