Sam Corderoy (*here on the left*) and Shua Turner are from *Netmakers*, a network of local churches working together on mission, so that everyone in our town knows the love of God and love of community. But we're not just for churches. We collaborate with schools, businesses, charities and local government too, so that together we can make the greatest difference.

One great example of this is the work that Shua is doing with a national charity called Transforming Lives for

Good (TLG). For over 30 years, TLG has been training individuals from churches to provide 1:1 mentoring support for young people in local schools, through a programme called Early Intervention Coaching.

Through this, we have a very exciting opportunity to serve our local schools and establish wider connections with families in the Harrogate area. Several schools have invited local churches to mentor children and teens who would benefit from some focused attention from a caring adult.

So, what about you? Do you have one hour a week to spend with a young person? An hour to listen, engage and help them navigate through a year of their life and all the emotions and experiences that come with it? There are no special qualifications needed. You will receive all the training you need. What you do need is a willing heart to explore how God might want to use you in this capacity.



Holocaust Memorial Day 2024

Holocaust Memorial Day is the day for everyone to remember the millions of people murdered in the Holocaust and in the genocides which followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia, and Darfur. The theme this year is *Fragility of Freedom*. In each of these

genocides, the groups who were persecuted had their freedom restricted and removed. The 1935 Nuremberg Laws stripped Jews of their German citizenship, made it illegal for them to do many jobs or to marry German non-Jews. Religion was outlawed by The Khmer Rouge regime - half the Cham Muslim population was murdered, as were 8,000 Christians. Today many people take freedoms for granted – but these freedoms need to be valued, as many people around the world still face restrictions to their freedoms to live, worship, work and love freely.

Light the Darkness

Each year people from across the UK take part in a national moment for Holocaust Memorial Day. **At 8:00 pm on 27th January people across the nation will light candles and put them in their windows to:**

- remember those who were murdered for who they were
- stand against prejudice and hatred today



Iconic buildings and landmarks will light up in purple during this powerful national moment of commemoration and solidarity. Please join in by placing a candle safely in your window at 8:00 pm this Saturday.
