When I Get Old (WIGO)

Working for better care and support in our older age

I spent most of my working life striving for better support choices for working-age adults with disabilities. Over 40 years, huge progress was made — driven by disabled people themselves — until it became widely accepted that they have a right to services that fit around them and allow them to give, live and love.

Then I retired and began facing my own older age. I was struck by how different the language is when it comes to older people: words like *burden*, *dependency*, *need* — and of course *cost*. The services on offer are limited (care homes or home care), focused mainly on safety and basic comfort, and often shaped more around the provider than the person. They are also eye-wateringly expensive. These are not the services I want for myself or those I love.

That realisation is the drive behind **When**I **Get Old (WIGO)**, a new charity with a simple vision: a world where older people — especially those who need a bit more help than before — can continue to live



adventurous and fulfilled lives. Older age inevitably brings challenges, but from the 300 or so people we've spoken to, the message is clear: we want to keep giving, living, and loving right to the very end, supported in ways that make this possible. We are a small organisation with great allies, relying on the knowledge, goodwill and energy of those who join our movement. 
