# An Update on our Finances

The start of a new year is a good time to reflect on the past and plan for the future. This is especially true when considering our financial position at St Peter's. As we finalise our 2022 year end accounts and new budget for 2023, we are struck by how fortunate we are for the incredible generosity of so many people at St Peter's who provide for our needs through both financial giving and their personal time and energy.

We started 2022 extremely grateful that we had a fixed price contract for our energy and the promise of a very large legacy which would ensure financial stability and deliver a year end surplus of around £80,000. As it turns out, the legacy has still not arrived due to unexpected delays; we have incurred significant costs with the need to replace our heating system; and the value of our reserves have been depleted by a fall in our long-term investments. Despite all these challenges, we doubled the amount we give as a Church to external charities and the result for the year will hopefully not be too far below breakeven once the investment losses are calculated.

The year 2023 brings a fresh set of challenges with a £20,000 increase in our Parish Share to £209,000. Our electricity contract also renews in March, which means our annual bill will rise by approximately £25,000 unless we can find a better contract. The budget is still being reviewed but given our known regular giving and some very generous legacy and donation payments, we expect another year where finances will be very tight, but we trust income will be close to our planned expenditure.

As you review your own finances perhaps you could consider small changes that could make a big difference to us here at St Peter's:

• If you haven't yet signed up for the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) please join the 70 people who already have, it really does make a difference as we collect the Gift Aid immediately. (*Full details on the back page of this Weekly News*).

Three mothers who lost their children to suicide started a memorial quilt project in Yorkshire to remember loved ones and support others. They asked anyone touched by suicide to make squares in memory of people who have taken their own lives. The finished quilt was unveiled in Leeds last year and is now on tour across Yorkshire - it is on display daily at Ripon Cathedral until 30<sup>th</sup> January. A film about how the quilt was made will also be shown. Admission is free.



# Ordinary People is the theme for Holocaust Memorial Day 2023

Genocide is facilitated by ordinary people. Ordinary people turn a blind eye, believe propaganda, join murderous regimes. And those who are persecuted, oppressed and murdered in genocide aren't persecuted because of crimes they've committed – they are persecuted simply because they are ordinary people who just happen to belong to a particular group.

Ordinary people were involved in all aspects of the Holocaust, the Nazi persecution of other groups, and in the genocides that took place in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur. Ordinary people were perpetrators, bystanders, rescuers, witnesses – and ordinary people were victims.

There are also extraordinary people in every genocide, remarkable and unusual people, who went to extreme lengths to help, to rescue, to save, and in every genocide there were extraordinary people, who went to extreme depths to cause harm, to persecute, to murder.

We are all ordinary people today who can be extraordinary in our actions. We can all make decisions to challenge prejudice, stand up to hatred, to speak out against identity-based persecution. To learn more visit <u>www.hmd.org.uk</u>.
