Feeding hungry people!

That's what Breakfast Club does and has done for 25 years!

But not just at breakfast time, and not only with food. In fact, our members' main hunger is for respect, acceptance, love, friendship and sometimes hugs.

Of course, food is important, and especially in the morning if you have been rough sleeping all night. Most of our members are not rough sleepers, as Harrogate is very good at searching these out, and making sure that they do not have to spend more than one night on the streets. But they often have no money for food, no proper home, no self-respect, nowhere to turn - for whatever reason.



We offer an excellent breakfast – hot porridge, hot beef soup, cheese and ham toasties, or toast with bacon and egg; all washed down with fruit juice, tea or coffee (with as much sugar as you like) – and a smile! We do Sunday lunches, evening meals three times a week and a free 'supermarket' once a week.

At any one time we probably have about one to two hundred on our books, and thirty-six helpers, who come from many different backgrounds and churches.

We are different because we don't ask questions, we don't push religion, and we make sure they are protected from outside influences, but we do need more food to pass on please. Thank you to all of you who generously finance our work and give us tins and fruit for us to share.

Harrogate School of Theology & Mission

Professor David Moffit speaks on 'Looking through the Kaleidoscope: Hebrews' Use of Old Testament Narratives in the Light of Jesus' Ascension and Awaited Return.'



Hebrews' engagement with the Old Testament is among the most exciting and creative in the New Testament. It creates a kaleidoscope of Biblical texts so that their interaction draws out the author's fundamental convictions about Jesus. We will explore three Old Testament figures mentioned in Hebrews—the high priest, Moses, and Joshua.

This live lecture is at St Mark's Church on Saturday 28th September, starting with a continental breakfast served from 9:30 am, then the lecture from 10:00 am – 12:00 pm. Tickets still cost only £8 per session (students £5 per session and under 18s free) including breakfast and refreshments. 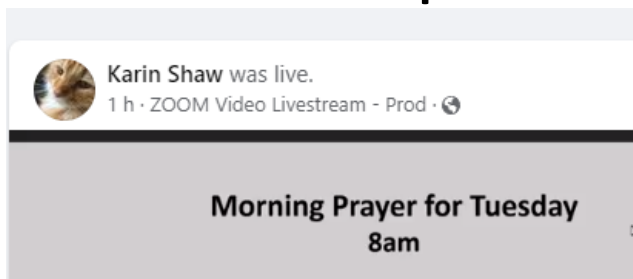
