# Could you serve on the Parochial Church Council?

Our Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) takes place on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> May at 7:00 pm at St Peter's Church. One thing we do at that meeting is elect new members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC). The PCC is the key decision-making body in the life of the church. It consists of clergy, churchwardens and others elected by the APCM. It is responsible for sharing the leadership, management and administration of a parish with the Vicar. To find out more about what it means to be a member of the PCC, and to see minutes of our previous meetings, visit the <u>Parochial Church Council</u> (PCC) page of the Church website.

To stand for election to the PCC you need to be an actual communicant, aged 16 or over, and not disqualified (e.g. by conviction of certain offences, disqualification as a company director or entry on a 'barred list'), and must be on the Church Electoral Roll (and, unless under 18, have been on the roll for at least 6 months). In addition, you will need to undertake around 3 to 4 hours of compulsory safeguarding training (online) and a DBS check.

We will have space for nine new elected council members and four Deanery Synod representatives. If you would like to find out more, then do talk with one of the Clergy, Churchwardens or existing members of the PCC. The nomination forms will be available from next Sunday at the Welcome Desk and can also be downloaded from the PCC page of the Church website from then. A healthy PCC is vital to the stability and vigour of the If you have relevant church. experience, or you are involved in an aspect of Church life that is currently underrepresented, please do consider standing.



23<sup>rd</sup> May in St Peter's Church you must be on the Electoral Roll.


#### Come and watch the Coronation Service and Processions in Church

# Harrogate School of Theology & Mission The former Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams, speaks on 'Contemplative life and urban mission'

Rowan William returns with a lecture addressing some intriguing issues in modern contemplative spirituality and its missional opportunities. Bishop Rowan tells us, "We will look briefly at three twentieth century figures – Russian, French and American – who attempted to live out a contemplative vocation in the setting of modern urban poverty, and will ask what we can learn from them about integrating contemplation and action".

This live lecture is at St Mark's Church on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> May, starting with a continental breakfast served from 9:30 am, then the lecture from 10:00 am – 12:00 pm. Tickets still cost only £8 per session (students £5 per session and under 18s free) including breakfast and refreshments. Fees are payable on the day by contactless card, cheque (payable to *Harrogate School of Theology & Mission*) or preferably in advance at Eventbrite.
