

Introducing the Parish Giving Scheme

PARISHGIVINGSCHEME

Today sees the soft launch of the Parish Giving Scheme at St Peter's. There will be a fuller campaign in May this year. What we need now is a good number of early adopters who can help us show how easy and effective the system is to set up, and how beneficial it is for St Peter's. The scheme has two big benefits:

- The Gift Aid on your donation is recovered automatically on the 10th day of every month. At present our Gift Aid Officer, Rob Lockwood, registers each Gift Aid claim individually. This a lot of work and makes regular claims impractical.
- You can inflation-proof your giving. This is your choice and, as the literature explains, you are in control of this process throughout. Did you know that if giving levels had kept track with inflation since the year 2000, they would have increased by more than 50%?

The enclosed 'Gift Form' explains exactly how you to join the Parish Giving Scheme – but if you have any questions David Hipkin, Sarah Martin, or the office of the Parish Giving Scheme, will be glad to help.

If you currently give by Standing Order, please note that you will need to cancel this once you have received notification from the Parish Giving Scheme. Do join us in giving St Peter's a more secure financial future!

Please pray for Tonga urges Bishop of Ripon

Tonga is part of the Anglican Church in Aotearoa New Zealand and Polynesia, where Bishop Helen-Ann served as a bishop. In July 2017, she and her husband Myles spent two weeks on the beautiful island, at the invitation of the then Archbishop of Polynesia, Winston Halapua (*pictured on her right*).

"In the past couple of days, Tonga has been struck by a devastating tsunami following the eruption of the nearby underwater volcano," Bishop Helen-Ann said. "We have



been unable to make contact with friends and former colleagues, and nor have our friends in New Zealand, some of whom have family living in Tonga. It is a worrying and anxious time for this nation state, already impacted by the climate crisis, rising sea levels and more extreme weather events," she added.

Candlemas – Wednesday 2nd February 2022 A light to lighten the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel



Falling exactly 40 days after Christmas, Candlemas (or The Presentation of Christ in the Temple) was observed as the official end of Christmas in medieval England. The date was also significant in pagan times because it is half way between the winter solstice and spring equinox – a day for celebrating the return of the light.

In Luke 2 v 22 - 49 the story of The Presentation of Christ in the Temple is told. According to the law of Moses, 40 days after his birth, Mary and Joseph bring their baby son to the temple where they sacrifice two doves. There they meet Simeon who has been told he will not die until he sees the Messiah. Simeon takes the baby into his arms, blesses God and says:

Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word; for mine eyes have seen thy salvation which thou hast prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to thy people Israel.

Candlemas celebrates Jesus coming as the light of the world. In earlier times all the candles intended to be used in the coming year would be placed outside the church to be blessed. They were then carried in a candlelit procession into the church. Ripon Cathedral still carries on this tradition with the lighting of over 7,000 candles in a series of glorious displays and a Candlemas Festal Eucharist with a candlelit procession. This

year this is on Wednesday 2nd February at 7:30 pm. At St Peter's we will be celebrating Candlemas next Sunday, 30th January, and are holding a special Candlemas Evensong. Please join us.
