Help to improve our visuals

When the pandemic first hit, we were glad of all the technology already installed in our church building. This enabled Chris Clayton and Steve Martin to set up livestreaming very quickly. This then developed into hybrid in-person/online services with projected liturgy. To make this work, however, we needed two screens either side of the Golden Gates ... which is how we ended up with a pulpit occupied by a television on a wooden box.



Efforts to replace this arrangement with something neater and more flexible have taken a very ... long ... time. With a lot of patient perseverance, on the part of Chris Clayton and Sian Lockwood, we now have a company ready to install new (more hidden) projectors and screens that roll up electronically, as well as the necessary planning permission to do so. The whole arrangement will provide clearer images when the projectors are in use and a clearer view of the sanctuary (and the pulpit) when they are not.

The total bill for this change is around £6,500. Some of this money has already been raised by dedicated refreshment days but there is still around £5,000 to find. If you would be willing to contribute to this project, please let me, Chris Clayton or David Hipkin (Treasurer) know. A simple and tax efficient way to donate is via the One-Off Donation facility provided by the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) – details of which can be found on the back page of the *Weekly News*. What is a Deanery?

Deaneries play an important part in the organisation of the Church. A Deanery is made up of all the Anglican parishes in a local area, and is overseen by an Area Dean (ordained) and a Lay Chair (not ordained). The Deanery Synod is a chance for these parishes to come together and address issues of

concern to the church and community at a local level. They can elect representatives to the Diocesan Synod and also to the General Synod, the legislative body of the Church of England. All the clergy of each parish are members of Deanery Synod automatically. Lay Representatives are elected by the Annual Parochial Church Meetings in their own parish and serve for three years.

Harrogate Deanery is one of six deaneries in the Ripon Episcopal Area of the Anglican Diocese of Leeds. It serves the parishes in Harrogate, Knaresborough, Starbeck, Wetherby and surrounding villages, by providing a channel of communication and a network of support. In January 2022 Alan Garrow became the Area Dean for the Harrogate Deanery.



Delicious food from over twenty countries – Afghanistan, Bosnia, France, Greece, Hong Kong, Japan, Switzerland, Norway and Ukraine, to name but a few – was enjoyed by the visitors.

The next Harrogate Deanery Synod will be on Wednesday 20th September at St James' Church in Birstwith.

The most recent Harrogate Deanery Synod took place at St Peter's on Tuesday 11th July. Before celebrating Communion together, the new Lay Chair, Treasurer, Secretary and Standing Committee were elected. Once the formal business was over, refreshments were served, which included dishes representing all the many nationalities associated with St Peter's Church.

St Wilfrid's Procession Saturday 29th July 2023



This year the annual St Wilfrid's Procession takes place in Ripon on Saturday 29th July.

Wilfrid was an English bishop and saint. He was born in the Kingdom of Northumbria around 633 and entered religious life as a teenager and studied at Lindisfarne, at Canterbury, in Francia, and at Rome. He returned to Northumbria in 658, and became the abbot of a newly founded monastery at Ripon.

The St Wilfrid's Procession around the City of Ripon dates back to 1108 when King Henry I granted a charter to the city to hold an annual feast each year around the 30th July. The full procession as we know it today with brightly decorated floats, bands and teams of Morris dancers, led by St Wilfrid on his horse, surrounded by his monks, is rumoured to have started in the 1950's.

This year the procession starts at 1:30 pm from Studley Road and passes through the Market Place for the first time at around 1:45 pm. Details of the route are available at <https://stwilfridsprocession.com/route-and-timings/>. At about 4:30 pm the procession arrives at the Cathedral for a short service and the prizes are given out.

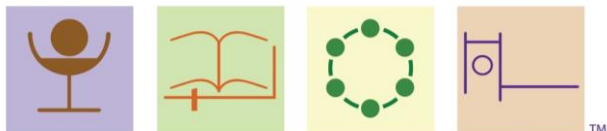
