Every year St Peter's Church gives at least £1,500 in donations to each of six different charities — this year two are working overseas, two are in Harrogate and two are in Bradford. These are the last two charities that we support, please pray for them all and the work that they do.

St Andrew's Evangelical Mission in Chosica, Peru

St Andrew's Evangelical Mission was set up almost 40 years ago by the Revd Brian Attwell and his Peruvian wife, Betty. After witnessing the poverty in the slums of Lima on a visit to Peru, the couple moved there and raised enough money to establish an orphanage – the St Andrew's Children's Home in Chosica. Since Brian's death in 2010, Betty has continued to run the Home and currently they care for about thirty abandoned, orphaned, and disabled children. They also run a day nursery, where mothers can bring their babies and toddlers while they go to work; and a clinic, where sick children and mothers are treated free of charge. The building of a school for the children is complete but now needs furnishing and equipping. Contact the Parish Office if you would like to make a donation.


Church Youth Worker at St Augustine's, Bradford



The Heart and Anchor Churches, St Augustine's (here on the left) and St Clement's are both located in the BD3 area of Bradford. It is in the top 1% most deprived neighbourhoods in the country. They are both Church of England parishes belonging to a shared Benefice; they share a Vicar, the Revd Rosy Fairhurst, and a Church Youth Worker, Anna Gullan - our donation helps to support her.

Previously a primary school teacher in Leeds, Anna joined the team in 2020. During the COVID pandemic, she did door stop visits; then she started a thriving youth group; she organises and plans school visits to the Churches; she is a Governor at Westminster C E Primary and takes weekly assemblies there — and so much more.
