
St Peter's Evening Fellowship

TO HOPE AND ACT WITH CREATION

SEASON OF CREATION 2024

The firstfruits of hope

The Season of Creation or Creationtide is the period in the annual church calendar dedicated to God as Creator and Sustainer of all life. Many churches choose to use this time of year to hold special services and events to give thanks for God's gift of creation, and to renew their commitment to caring for our one planet home. Creationtide begins next Sunday 1st September and ends on 4th October, the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of the environment, animals and birds.

The theme for *Creationtide* this year is to hope and act with *Creation*, and the symbol is the firstfruits of hope, inspired by Romans 8 v 19-25. In the letter of Paul to the Romans, the biblical image pictures Creation as a Mother, groaning as in childbirth – 22 We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labour pains until now. Francis of Assisi understood this when he referred to the Earth as a mother.

The times we live in show that we are not relating to the Earth as a gift from our Creator, but rather as a resource to be exploited. 'Creation has been groaning' because of our selfishness and our unsustainable actions that harm her. Along with the Earth, creatures of all kinds, including humans, cry out because of our destructive actions causing climate crisis, loss of biodiversity, and human suffering as well as Creation's suffering.

And yet, there is hope and the expectation for a better future. To hope in a biblical context does not mean to stand still and quiet, but rather groaning, crying, and actively striving for new life amidst the struggles. Just as in childbirth, mothers go through a period of intense pain, but new life springs forth.
