

Stephen, First Martyr (Boxing Day)

On the feast of Stephen



People whose birthdays fall near Christmas often feel their day gets overshadowed by the holiday. The same might be said of Stephen, whose day is celebrated on 26th December. The most common mention of the saint's day is in a Christmas carol that's not even about him, but about another saint, Good King Wenceslas, who went out and helped the poor, 'on the feast of Stephen'.

As it turns out, performing acts of charity is an apt way to celebrate the feast of Stephen, who was chosen by members of the early Christian Church to minister to widows and the poor. Stephen was one of seven men, 'deeply spiritual and prudent,' selected to be the first deacons of the Church in Jerusalem. In addition to this ministry, Stephen performed great signs and wonders in Jesus'

name. The Acts of the Apostles calls him 'a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit'. However, while Stephen preached eloquently about Jesus and the Kingdom of God, not everyone in the community agreed with him. Some of the temple leaders plotted against him, accusing him of blasphemy. They encouraged others to give false witness before the Sanhedrin about what Stephen had said and done. Stephen's response to these accusations (Acts 7 v 1 - 53) made them even angrier, and when Stephen looked up to the sky and exclaimed that he saw Jesus standing at God's right hand, they were enraged. He was dragged out of the city and stoned to death—making Stephen the first Christian martyr. The account in Acts has many parallels with the trial and death of Jesus Christ. As Stephen was stoned, he prayed, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.' As he died, Stephen said, 'Lord do not hold this sin against them.'

When Good King Wenceslas took food and firewood to the poor man who lived in the woods beyond his castle, he was celebrating 'the feast of Stephen' in a way that the saint would probably have approved of — by taking care of the poor.
