WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

(A women led, global, ecumenical movement)



The World Day of Prayer (WDP) takes place on the first Friday of March and has a special annual theme which is developed by women of a different country each year. A national committee then prepares an order of service on that theme which is used all over the world. This year WDP is on Friday 3rd March, the theme is *I have heard about your faith* and the country that has been chosen in Taiwan.

The theme of the WDP 2023 is based on Ephesians 1 v 15 - 19, the letter sent to a faith community to express gratitude by Paul. He gave thanks to God for the Ephesians living out their love and faith, and prayed that they could see these three truths: the hope to which God has called the disciples, the riches of God's glorious inheritance among the saints, and the immeasurable greatness of God's power.

Taiwan is a country in East Asia made up of one main island surrounded by many much smaller islands. It is located in the north-western Pacific Ocean, with the People's Republic of China to the northwest, Japan to the northeast, and the Philippines to the south. With an approximate population of 23.6 million people, Taiwan is a densely populated multi-ethnic country, with sixteen officially recognized

languages. Mainland China has during the past three years ramped up pressure on Taiwan to accept Chinese sovereignty, including staging regular military exercises near the democratically governed islands. Taiwan's government rejects China's territorial claims.

There is a World Day of Prayer service at West Park URC at 2:00 pm on Friday 3rd March. All are welcome.

Harrogate School of Theology & Mission

Professor Paul Foster, from the School of Divinity at the University of Edinburgh, speaks on 'The Apostolic Fathers: Christianity in the first half of the second century'

During the first and second centuries a group of miscellaneous Christian leaders wrote down their understanding of the meaning of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. They were considered by later Biblical scholars to be the next generation of Apostles and as a result were named The Apostolic Fathers. Their writing contains an essential insight into the development of the early Christian Church and Christian thinking.



This live lecture is at St Mark's Church on Saturday 11th March, starting with a continental breakfast served from 9:30 am, then the lecture from 10:00 am – 12:00 pm. Tickets still cost only £8 per session (students £5 per session and under 18s free) including breakfast and refreshments. Fees are payable on the day by contactless card, cheque (payable to Harrogate School of Theology & Mission) or preferably in advance at <u>Eventbrite</u>.

Aspire to new habits this Lent

Walking through the wilderness of recent years has taught me that it is very easy to 'fall out of the habit'. For many of us, there are aspects of the life of our churches that have simply not returned. Some people have taken the opportunity given by our collective pause to reassess their church roles and step back. Some of our habits have been



quite difficult to get going once more. For our community at Holy Nativity, it has taken until last month to be able to restart Rock Mass each month. Like a steam locomotive whose fire has long since gone cold, it has taken much work and a lot of effort to get many or our church communities moving once more.

It is with this backdrop that we approach Lent after a brief window of ordinary time in so many aspects of our daily lives. This may be a longed-for season in which you aspire to form new spiritual habits. Perhaps however, the thought of now losing something else familiar fills you with dread. Maybe you are just clinging on to the ever growing to do list with your fingernails and thoughts of Lent aren't even on your horizon yet.

Before I came to faith, the people around me often approached Lent like New Year's resolutions. Pancakes and syrup were followed by a day or two without Mars Bars. Later as an adult convert, my now wife Ruth, taught me to enter Lent as a spiritual discipline, bringing us back into the presence of the Divine. As we have grown together, Ruth has taught me that Lenten discipline can shape and mould our discipleship, forming habits that extend long beyond Easter Morning. From where I sit at my desk, I can spot the office bins from the corner of my eye. These simple baskets are a remnant from the year we took up recycling everything-that-is-possible. An Ikea steel-mesh reminder of that which was taken up that persists throughout the ages.

Whether enthusiastically seizing each day or wearily dreading the wilderness, may we each discover habits old or new, big or small that bring us closer to the presence of God as we journey together towards the cross.
