For a Better Future is the theme for Holocaust Memorial Day 2025



Most children were immediately killed upon arrival at the concentration camps. These child survivors were photographed a few days after the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau by the Red Army in January 1945.

Holocaust Memorial Day 2025 (HMD 2025) on Monday 27th January marks the 80th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi concentration camp complex, and the 30th anniversary of the genocide in Bosnia.

Auschwitz concentration camp was of Nazi concentration complex extermination camps located in occupied Poland during World War II. It was the the largest of concentration and extermination camps, where over 1.1 million people, mostly Jews, were murdered between 1940 and 1945.

Eighty years on from the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, antisemitism (anti-Jewish hatred) has increased significantly in the UK and globally following the attacks in Israel by Hamas on 7th October 2023 and

the subsequent war in Gaza. Extremists are also exploiting the situation to stir up anti-Muslim hatred in the UK. Many UK communities are feeling vulnerable, with hostility and suspicion of others rising. We hope that HMD 2025 can be an opportunity for people to come together, learn both from and about the past, and take actions to make a better future for all.

There are many things we can all do to create a better future. We can speak up against Holocaust and genocide denial and distortion; we can challenge prejudice; we can encourage others to learn about the Holocaust and more recent genocides. 
Fundraising Refreshment Day



The Archbishops of Canterbury and York lead the vision and direction of the Church of England



The Archbishop of Canterbury is the Church's most senior bishop. He or she oversees the ministry and mission in the southern two-thirds of England and fills a unique position as spiritual leader in the worldwide Anglican Church. The second most senior bishop is the Archbishop of York, who oversees the ministry and mission in the northern third of England. Together they lead the vision and direction of the Church of England.

The Archbishop of Canterbury is the 'Primate of All England' (the 'first bishop' of England), the metropolitan archbishop of the ecclesiastical province of Canterbury which covers the southern two-thirds of England, and the bishop of the Diocese of Canterbury.


While no one is recognised as head of all the churches that constitute the Anglican Communion, the Archbishop of Canterbury is regarded as its titular leader – the first among equals – and exercises considerable spiritual authority beyond the province of Canterbury. The Archbishop of Canterbury presides over the Lambeth Conferences, the decennial meeting of the bishops of the Anglican Communion, and is president of the Anglican Consultative Council.

The Rt Revd Justin Welby concluded his ministry as the 105th Archbishop of Canterbury at midnight on 7th January 2024. Under the instrument of delegation, his official functions have been delegated mainly to the Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell, with some to the Bishop of London, Dame Sarah Mullally (*on the right*), and diocesan functions to the Bishop of Dover, the Rt Revd Dr Rose Hudson-Wilkin.

The Crown Nominations Commission will lead the process of appointing the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury. You can learn more about the appointment of the new Archbishop in the Weekly News in the coming weeks.
