

#### RAISE THE RED ENSIGN FOR MERCHANT NAVY DAY 3RD SEPTEMBER



Mark your calendars for **Merchant Navy Day on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> September**, as we celebrate the faces behind the Red Ensign — the dedicated men and women who serve or have served as merchant seafarers. Their bravery has kept supply lines open during World Wars, and they continue to serve as key workers, ensuring the delivery of essential goods, including food and medicines, to the UK. The Red Ensign is the flag flown on all Merchant Navy vessels.

In 1928, King George V bestowed the title of 'Merchant Navy' on the British merchant shipping fleets to honour the sacrifice of merchant seafarers in World War I. During wartime, the Merchant Navy became an essential part of the support to carry servicemen and their supplies overseas. They were involved in the Battle of the Atlantic, struggling to deliver food, fuel, equipment, and raw materials. Over 14,000 people died in World War I, and more than 30,000 in World War II.

## **Commemorating 100 years of Harrogate's War Memorial**

As well as the major exhibition at West Park URC, which starts on Friday, there is a comprehensive programme of illustrated events to mark the centenary. They tell the stories of the names inscribed on Harrogate's war memorial, and expand on the time when two world wars changed Britain through film, music, and talks. The exhibition *More* 



than a name on a Memorial starts on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> September and runs on Fridays (10:00 am – 4:00 pm), Saturdays (10:00 am – 4:00 pm) and Sundays (1:00 – 5:00 pm) until 12<sup>th</sup> November. Entry is free. On 3<sup>rd</sup> September there is a screening of the film *Bridge* on the River Kwai at the Harrogate Odeon in aid of SSAFA North Yorkshire. Tickets cost £10 and are available from the <u>Harrogate Film Society website</u>.
