## **Artizan International**

Artizan International enables, empowers and supports people with disabilities to reach their full potential.

The charity was founded in 2013 by Susie Hart MBE on her return to the UK after living in Tanzania, where she founded Neema Crafts.

At the *Artizan Cafe & Creative Space* on Cambridge Road they provide therapeutic arts and

crafts workshops for people with disabilities; a youth club for disabled young adults; a training café, which trains 30 young adults with learning disabilities; a free after school club; and a school mosaic project to educate children and staff all over Yorkshire about disabilities. Each week a team of staff and volunteers run *Artizan Organics* workshops, where disabled members make natural products including candles, hand cream and soaps, which are sold in their shop in Oxford Street, alongside the crafts produced by their artisans overseas.

In Latin America the centre in Ecuador provides training in paper-making, jewellery, screen-printing and sewn textiles, providing disabled artisans with skills and employment, lifting them out of poverty. In Arequipa, Peru, the centre includes crafts training spaces, a fair-trade shop, and a new café which opened in December 2023. *Artizan* purchases their work and sells it in their shop in Harrogate.

The London Schools Symphony Orchestra (LSSO), considered one of the finest youth orchestras in the world, appears at Ripon Cathedral as part of their 2025 summer tour on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> August from 7:30 – 10:00 pm. The LSSO has a prestigious history of over 70 years, nurturing young musical talent and providing orchestral training for young musicians aged 13 - 19.

They oversee the clergy, guide the church's mission and ensure that worship, teaching, and pastoral care are faithfully carried out.


