### The first day of Advent and of a new church year



Today is the first day of Advent and the beginning of the new Liturgical year – Year A in the three-year cycle of readings. We will be lighting the first candle on our Advent wreath, which is purple and symbolizes **HOPE**. Three of the candles are purple, because it is the liturgical colour for Advent that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. The rose candle signifies **JOY** and will be lit on the third Sunday. Our Advent Candle Service starts at 6:30 pm tonight.



### **Today St Peter's welcomes Helen Jones**

I am an ordinand in training, in my first year at St Hild's College, Mirfield. I am 49, live in York and am married to Robert, with no children. I am being sponsored by the Diocese of York for full-time incumbency and hope to obtain a stipendiary position once I am ordained.

I have been a Christian all my life. I was brought up a Roman Catholic, but have worshipped in the Church of England since my twenties, mostly at the more traditional end of the Church of England. I am a musician and have always been drawn to the beauties of the Anglican choral

tradition. In my home church of St Olave, York, I am involved in ministry through reading the lesson, leading intercessions, serving at the altar, acting as PCC secretary and singing in the choir.

I am educated to PhD level, with a Cambridge history degree and a PhD in church history (focusing on female Christianity in 18<sup>th</sup> century England) from King's College London. I have worked most of my career in University administration, for several years in Admissions and more recently in research support. I also teach a small number of piano students, and undertake opportunities to perform as a pianist and singer. In voluntary roles at various times in my life I have been active in local political parties, *Amnesty International* groups, visiting the elderly, baptism catechetics, youth fellowship and primary school reading support.
