## Creationtide: 1<sup>st</sup> September – 4<sup>th</sup> October 2022

Creationtide or the Season of Creation begins on 1<sup>st</sup> September, the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and ends on 4<sup>th</sup> October, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the saint most associated with animals and the natural environment.

The theme for the Season of Creation 2022 is **Listen to the Voice of Creation**. During the COVID-19 pandemic, we have become familiar with the concept of being muted in conversations. With respect to the climate crisis, too many voices are also silenced, including the voices of scientists, biodiversity experts, and those who suffer the worst impacts of the climate crisis.



### The symbol for 2022 is the burning bush

*I have heard their cry ... I know their sufferings ... Come now I will send you ... I will be with you (Exodus 3 v 1 – 12)*

Today, the prevalence of wild fires are a sign of the devastating effects that climate change has on the most vulnerable of our planet. By contrast, the fire that called to Moses did not consume or destroy the bush. This was a flame of the Spirit that revealed God's life sustaining presence. Moses was told to remove his sandals, for he was standing on holy ground in God's presence. May this symbol move us to remove the 'sandals' of our unsustainable lifestyles that disconnect us from creation and our Creator, contemplate our connection to the holy ground where we live, and listen for the voice of creation. 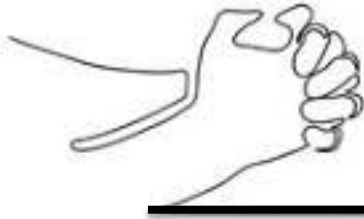

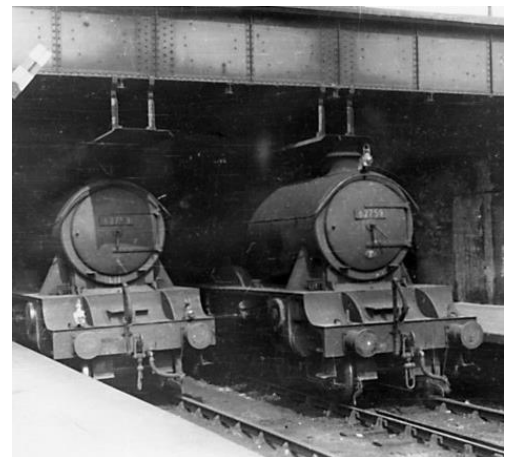
## St Peter's Evening Fellowship
