## Absolutely the most delicious mango we've ever tasted!

This Fairtrade Fortnight our spotlight is on Burkina Faso where Swiss fair-trade company *Gebana* is investing in people and the environment. Countries like this are often seen as high risk so don't get the investment they need, but *Gebana* has worked here for over 20 years, creating close and supportive links with farmers.

They've also built a factory where the mango is dried and cashews are processed - another way of investing in local people, rather than just shipping the raw product straight out of the country.

Worker safety is really important at the factory. Cashew workers around the world get serious burns from the corrosive liquid inside the shells, but here workers have goggles to protect their eyes and cashew oil for their hands - a natural antidote much more effective than wearing gloves.

Gebana's commitment to the environment starts with organic farming but it doesn't stop there. The waste from cashews powers the factory and creates an amazing by product: biochar. When mixed with composted mango skins it creates a fertiliser

that binds carbon into the soil, making it a brilliant tool for fighting climate change. In the UK *Gebana* partners with *Tropical Wholefoods* whose range of dried fruit and nuts we sell in the *Harrogate Fairtrade Shop*. We think their mango is absolutely the most delicious we've ever tasted! And the creamy cashews are just as wonderful. This Fairtrade Fortnight join us in supporting farmers and the environment ... and treat yourself at the same time!

## Come to The Market Day Café next Thursday


