# Sharing one bread and one cup

The decision to stop sharing the chalice was made for us in the pandemic, but local churches have been left to work out their own post-pandemic practice. Some churches continue to administer by intinction (dipping the bread in the wine), others have been sharing the chalice for some time.

We instinctively suspect that sharing a cup must increase the risk of cross-infection. This is not something we do in any other context! Research published in 1988 (admittedly some time ago) concluded, however, that: 'No episode of disease attributable to the shared communion cup has ever been reported. Currently available data do not provide any support for suggesting that the practice of sharing a common communion cup should be abandoned because it might spread infection.' It seems that the use of fortified wine in a silver cup means that the risk of cross-infection is reduced to a level that is essentially undetectable. There is greater risk standing in the queue to receive Communion.

As we review our practice, I recognise that sharing the chalice is something not everyone will feel comfortable with. So, for the next period at least, intinction will

remain an option.

At our 9:30 am Family Communion, please receive Communion in St Mary's Chapel. If you attend other services, please sit at the front of the congregation and come to the communion rail at the first possible opportunity.


#### Northern Ballet's Ugly Duckling returns to the stage






### Two devotional digital resources for Holy Week



Holy Week is the name given to the week beginning on Palm Sunday (2<sup>nd</sup> April) and ending on Easter Sunday (9<sup>th</sup> April).

Walking the Way of the Cross is a podcast series written and recorded by Archbishop Stephen Cottrell, Dr Paula Gooder and Bishop Philip North, that will take people on the Holy Week journey by exploring and reflecting on the fifteen biblical Stations of the Cross. This form of devotion offers a particularly vivid way of following in the steps of Jesus on his way from Pilate's house to Calvary.

Women of Holy Week, written by Dr Paula Gooder, explores Holy Week through the eyes of nine female characters she imagines accompanying Jesus during these momentous days, with artwork by Ally Barrett. On Palm Sunday follow Miriam, a fish trader from Galilee, who has come to Jerusalem for Passover. It is available as a book or e-book to buy or a free podcast. Both resources can be found on the <u>Lent</u>, <u>Holy Week and Easter page of the Church of England's website</u>.
