The BIG Conversation About Food at St Peter's

Food has always been a big part of the ministry and life of St Peter's and, for the past twenty-five years, Breakfast Club has been a big part of how we've communicated who we are and what we're about. The recent changes in Breakfast Club mean that now is a good time to reflect on the place of food in the whole of our shared life. The biggest lesson from my research as a biblical historian is that the first Christians used food to communicate what they believed in and hoped for. How can we, in our own time and place, do the same?

This question is at the heart of *The Big Conversation about Food*. The 'conversation starter' is a survey with questions that we would like you to reflect on and answer. The questions are designed to capture your opinions, aspirations, ideas and willingness to help. Your answers will help us reflect together on the past, while shaping our vision for the future.

The funeral of Nick Starmer



Nick's funeral, led by Hannah Beck, was held at St Peter's Church on Friday 24th January. Nick's dog, Mia, was also there. His brother, Sir Keir Starmer, spoke movingly about Nick and expressed the family's gratitude for all those who had cared for him over the last few years. He said, "Nick rocked up at St Peter's and helped out where he could. Thank you to all the people from St Peter's here who made Nick feel at home. Especially Hannah, who took him in when he needed shelter, looked after him, and made him feel safe and loved. Hannah was also with Nick when he died, which meant he didn't die alone. He had Hannah there and Mia his beloved dog lying beside him on his bed. That meant a lot to our family, thank you Hannah!" After the committal at Stonefall Crematorium, the family returned to share refreshments at St Peter's. We were glad to gift the family drawings of Nick and Mia created by local artist Shirley Hudson for our Lent 2022 exhibition in the Glass Foyer 'A Place at the Table'.
