St Peter's Evening Fellowship: 7:30 pm Thursday 6th June

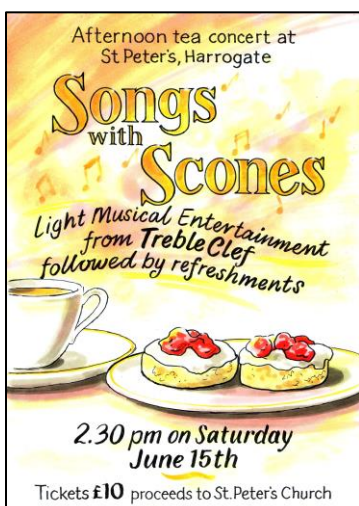

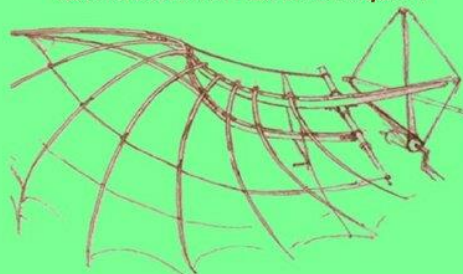
