They were always fed – the five thousand on the hill, the twelve in the upper room, his friends on the beach. Fed to bursting and there were leftovers besides.

And he was always sitting at table with people he claimed as his own - the tax collectors and the sinners. Mary and Martha, Zacchaeus, and his friends on the Emmaus Road. Wherever he was. people fed. were Wherever you found



him, he was sharing bread. What a model for us today! When we share together, all sorts of feeding takes place – minds open, hearts and spirits sit down together, the present is sated and the future is nourished. When we share like family at a table, we meet and remember who Jesus was and who he calls us to be. Communion, eating together, sharing with unconstrained generosity and justice, that is the harvest that feeds Christ's vision.

Christian Aid's vision is of a world free from poverty and hunger – where everyone has enough. Across the Horn of Africa, 18.4m people are regularly going hungry; 7.1 million children are malnourished, including 2 million severely malnourished children. Projections indicate that 25.3 million people in the Horn of Africa will face



high levels of food insecurity in the coming months. #### Wilfrid's World - an Autumn Lecture Series at Ripon Cathedral 'Wilfrid, Willibrord and the Expansion of Christian Europe' Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> October, 7:30 – 9:30 pm

In the third lecture James Palmer, Professor of Mediaeval History at the University of St Andrews looks even farther afield, examining Wilfrid's role in bringing Christianity to north-west Europe. He undertook missionary work here himself, and also supported the mission of Willibrord, Apostle of the Frisians, who had begun his religious career as a member of the Ripon monastic community under Wilfrid.
