#### The Action in the Ghetto of Rohatyn

Today we welcome members of the local Jewish community, who will be joining us for our **Holocaust Memorial Service** at 11:00 am. During the service the poem 'The Action in the Ghetto of Rohatyn, March 1942' by Alexander Kimel will be read.

This is the story of the events of 20<sup>th</sup> March 1942, in Rohatyn, a market town in German occupied Poland during the Second World War.



Although the Second World War started in September 1939 when Germany invaded Poland, their army didn't arrive in Rohatyn until July 1941.

By the end of 1941 the Rohatyn Ghetto was established segregating Jews from the rest of the population; no one could leave or enter without a special permit. Jews from the surrounding area and refugees fleeing from Germany and western Poland were rounded up and sent there. The overcrowded living conditions were horrific; every day at least 40 people died of starvation; diseases like typhus and dysentery; and the cold.

Early in the morning on 20<sup>th</sup> March 1942 the Gestapo surrounded the ghetto and forcibly marched 3,000 Jewish adults and 600 Jewish children to the town square. These Jews were then taken on foot and by trucks to a deep pit a short distance behind Rohatyn railway station, where they were systematically murdered in a single day by rifle fire, in small groups lined up and facing the pit, shot from behind. They were buried there in a mass grave.

Jack Glotzer, who survived that day, wrote, "The ghetto now was almost empty. People moved about confusedly for the first few days after the action, unable to grasp what had happened. Those who were left had lost their families, wives, husbands, children, mothers and fathers, and wandered about like a frightened flock of sheep. Everybody looked for relatives, friends or even acquaintances with whom he could live, for someone with whom he could mourn, though there were no longer any tears."
