UK Churches' Relay to COP26 - #RiseToTheMoment



The Young Christian Climate Network (YCCN) are a group of Christians aged 18 to 30 and they are organising a Relay from the G7 in Cornwall ($11^{th} - 13^{th}$ June 2021) to the COP26 UN climate talks in Glasgow which start on 1^{st} November. They are doing this as an act of solidarity and faith, believing that no country should be pushed further into debt because of climate change. Although this relay is organised by young adults, they welcome and encourage participants of

any age. However, for safeguarding reasons, children and teens must be accompanied by someone over 18 who takes responsibility for them.

COP26 is a moment of decision and opportunity. Five years ago, 195 countries gave a verbal commitment to limit global warming to 2°C and pursue limiting it to 1.5°C through the Paris Agreement. But this commitment has not yet been converted into sufficient action. This year is a key milestone when countries can choose to increase their commitment over the next five years and take worthwhile action to avoid the worst effects of climate change.

The current route is over 750 miles long and the dates give 139 days, of which 80 – 90 days will be spent walking. The remaining days will be used for residencies and celebrations in prominent locations such as cathedrals, churches and museums in cities across the UK, including York. The relay will pass through our Diocese en route to Glasgow in September. It's an exciting opportunity for people of all ages to raise awareness and raise their voices for climate action. The Cathedrals Cycle Route launches today!

The 2,000 mile Cathedrals Cycle Route is the invention of academic, entrepreneur and keen cyclist Shaun Cutler, from Northumbria University, and is designed to help us all out of lockdown with opportunities for short cycle rides between all our 42 Anglican cathedrals, forging new partnerships and fundraising for physical and mental well-being charities.

Shaun and a small group of cyclists will launch the route with a relay event, *Cycling With Purpose*, setting out from Newcastle Cathedral (*right*), the most northerly Anglican Cathedral, on Sunday 30th May. The relay will



coincide with *The World's Biggest Bike Ride*, marking the opening day of Bike Week (30th May – 5th June 2021), the annual celebration of all things cycling, delivered by Cycling UK.



The second leg takes riders the 55 miles from the stunning cathedral at Durham and ends at our own Ripon Cathedral.
