St Peter's Pastoral Care Team

St Peter's Pastoral Care Team (PCT) offers support and care during times of illness, hospitalisation, bereavement, loneliness and inability to access church. We visit people at home, do food shopping, deliver food during illness, keep in touch by telephone, link with relatives, offer essential transport and Home Communion. Members of the team all undergo safeguarding training, and an introductory selfpaced Pastoral Conversations course. This gives a basic introduction to pastoral care, good listening and pastoral conversation skills. If you would like to be better equipped to care for the vulnerable, and to reflect the love and care of Jesus, then

this course is for you. It is available to all via the Leeds Diocese Digital Learning Platform.



As a member of the PCT, I have recently completed the Pastoral Assistant Training course, which is designed for those wishing to go deeper into pastoral conversations, safeguarding issues, understanding grief and loss, handling sensitive topics, understanding human and spiritual development and a basic understanding of dementia and mental health. It follows a 'flipped classroom approach', with something to read or

watch before each session. There is a social café where participants can link with each other to discuss course topics and content; a good reflective learning tool. The tutors are excellent and very friendly - a wonderful opportunity to gain a greater insight into pastoral care. Do speak with me if you'd like to learn more.
