Little Amal travels 8,000 km to raise awareness of child refugees



Little Amal meets a refugee boy at Breil sur Roya in the Alpes-Maritime region near the Italian border.

Little Amal, a 3.5 metre (nearly 12') tall puppet, has walked across Europe to shine a light on the stories of millions of young refugees. She has travelled through eight countries, and been welcomed by hundreds of cultural events in cities, towns and villages all along her route. Little Amal started her 5,000 mile journey in Gaziantep, Turkey, near the Syrian border on 27th July 2021 and this week on 3rd November she will reach her final destination - Manchester.

Through this theatre project, **Good Chance**, in collaboration with the creators of *War Horse*, aim to draw attention to all displaced children,

many separated from their families, whose plight has been overshadowed by the COVID pandemic. Little Amal has walked in their footsteps so that we don't forget them. Find out more at www.walkwithamal.org/about-us/little-amal
