# A Tale of Two Texts

In AD 48 James the brother of Jesus and the Jerusalem Apostles wrote a letter to the Gentile Christians in Antioch explaining the basis on which they could become members of the Jewish Jesus movement. This document had a star-studded set of authors, excellent distribution (by the Apostle Paul) and very high value for Gentile Christians (it legitimised their inclusion), and yet it disappeared almost without trace. The only surviving record is a four-line precis in the Book of Acts. A little later this same letter was being used in situations for which it had not been originally designed – and this was creating tensions. To deal with the problem a second edition was created. This important document also became lost – except for a possible reference in 3 John chapter 9.

In 1873 an early Christian text calling itself The Teaching of the Lord, by the Twelve Apostles, to the Gentiles, (commonly known as The Didache) was discovered in Constantinople. The text provides puzzlingly contradictory advice about the kind of matters addressed by the Apostles all those years ago. Could it be that it preserves the two editions of the Apostles' letter wedged together? If so, perhaps this curious double-text will give us a fresh perspective on what the first Christians saw as truly important.

This is the question addressed by: 'Kitchen Visions of the First Christians', a lecture by the Revd Dr

### St Peter's Evening Fellowship



- 30. Start simple: gather together a few bags of your belongings to take to your local charity shop. And not just the scraps let's give some good stuff away too!


