


The local branch of Amnesty International will be marking <u>International</u> Women's Day in church on Saturday morning, 9th March from 10.00-1.00pm.

There will be the chance to sign letters and petitions on behalf of women worldwide who are abused, silenced and imprisoned for standing up for human rights. We will feature Salma al-Shebab, whose appalling treatment we have been protesting about for some time, whose case was reported by LeedsLive:

"A Leeds University student who returned to Saudi Arabia for a holiday has been jailed for 34 years for having a Twitter account and for following and retweeting dissident activists. Salma al-Shehab, 34, posted tweets calling for women's rights in Saudi Arabia. The tweets led to her being accused of using Twitter to 'cause public unrest and destabilise civil and national security.' The mum-of-two was initially sentenced to six years in jail, but her sentence was increased to 34 years at a Saudi terrorism court after the activist appealed her sentence. She will also face a 34-year travel ban upon her release."


Friday 8th March is International Women's Day – Inspire Inclusion
