

Hope rooted in relationship

Things will get better! On what basis can we have this kind of confidence? What makes the difference between a general, sunny optimism and a deep, resilient hope?



The difference is relationship. If we are part of a universe fashioned by God, part of a story in which God's loving purpose has the final word, and people whom God has called into covenant relationship a covenant relationship sealed by the events of Holy Week and Easter - then, even when we live through darkness, loss and lament, we have a basis for a and resilient hope. deep Better than just being able to say, 'things will get better', we can say, 'we are treasured by a God who gave himself on the cross and whose loving purposes can never defeated.' So 'Happy Easter!' means, in fact, 'rejoice in your relationship-rooted hope'.

Andrew Ripley OBE was an English rugby union international, who represented England from 1972 to 1976, and the British Lions on their unbeaten 1975 tour of South Africa. An all-round athlete, and a qualified yachtsman, he won the BBC's Superstars television series in 1980. In 2005 he was diagnosed with advanced prostate cancer. He wrote this poem in the foreword to his book whilst in remission:

Dare we hope? We dare.

Can we hope? We can.

Should we hope? We must.

We must, because to do otherwise is to waste the most precious of gifts, given so freely by God to all of us. So when we do die, it will be with hope and it will be easy and our hearts will not be broken.

Andy Ripley, 10th June 2007, Athlone Friary Sadly, the cancer returned, and Andy Ripley died on 17th June 2010, aged 62.

We are looking for volunteers to distribute these


delivery-only envelopes in a street of your choice. Can you help us?




