

Human Rights Day 2022 - dignity, freedom, and justice for all Every year on 10<sup>th</sup> December, the world celebrates Human Rights Day, the very day when, in 1948, the United Nations General Assembly adopted the <u>Universal</u> <u>Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR)</u>. The UDHR sets out a broad range of fundamental human rights and freedoms to which all of us, everywhere around the world, are entitled.

In the decades since the adoption of the UDHR, human rights have become more recognised and guaranteed across the globe. The Declaration is the foundation of human rights protections that today focus on vulnerable groups such as persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples and migrants.



However, the promise of the UDHR, of dignity and equality in rights, has been under a sustained assault in recent vears. As the world faces challenges and ongoing – pandemics, new conflicts, exploding inequalities, а bankrupt global morally financial system, racism, climate change – many vulnerable groups of people are being left behind.

The 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the UDHR will be celebrated on 10<sup>th</sup> December 2023. The year-long campaign, launched on this year's Human Rights Day, seeks to shift the needle of understanding and action towards greater knowledge of the universality of the UDHR and the activism associated with it.
