Ethics Matters – to everyone

What are the implications for our society of the recent Assisted Dying Bill? Why is the UK birth rate falling and what ethical questions are raised by surrogacy? Why do some people, including religious believers, think war can be just? Can ancient religious principles and more recent international laws cope with modern conflicts and technologies – both in terms of when it is just to go to war and how a war is fought? Whose interests should businesses consider when making decisions? Is capitalism a force for good, or evil, in the world today? What are the potential benefits and costs of generative AI? Should AI be regulated and is such regulation

These are just some of the questions addressed in six Thursday evening lectures, beginning this week on 9th January, by influential author and thinker Dr Peter Vardy. 

Nick Starmer and Mia

Nick Starmer, a member of Breakfast Club, died, aged 60, on Boxing Day this year.

Hannah Beck writes, "Nick will be very much missed by Breakfast Club, and especially at the Sunday lunches. He originally 'rocked up' at St Peter's Church doors shortly before Covid. He made friends very easily - although being deaf he could be choosy if he wanted to - and became a regular each morning, even after he had been housed by the Council. He had a great sense of humour and was always cheerful. To us he was always just Nick, with Mia his very faithful and well-behaved dog.

After moving to Leeds, he came over every weekend and helped on Sundays putting out and setting up tables, and later helping serve with the others at Sunday lunches and the Sunday Lunch Club. He did all jobs cheerfully and willingly, never needing to be told what to do. His illness was difficult for us all, but he never complained – just got on with the job in hand. Even this Christmas Day, he was in his place by the hatch in Church – we will always remember him. Mia is still cared for by us and remains Nick's dog."

Hannah and other members of the Breakfast Club did an exceptional job of caring for Nick, who had cancer, throughout his illness.

The Bishop of Kirkstall, Arun Arora, speaks on 'Living Faithfully: Rediscovering Michael Ramsey's Five Spiritual Helps'



Michael Ramsey (the 100th Archbishop of Canterbury, 1961-1974) offered his Five Helps as spiritual principles for living a faithful Christian life. Although Ramsay formulated these many decades ago, Bishop Arun will help us to understand how relevant they remain and how we can use them as foundations for a Christ-centered life. Bishop Arun is known as a thought-provoking and entertaining speaker.

This live lecture is at St Mark's Church on Saturday 18^{th} January starting with breakfast served from 9:30 am, then the lecture from 10:00 am - 12:00 pm. Tickets cost £8 (students £5 and under 18s free) and includes breakfast and refreshments. This lecture is also available on Zoom at a cost of £5. 
