Imagine being a cocoa farmer in West Africa, nurturing your plants for five years before they produce a crop. You take the cocoa pods to market only to discover the price has dropped haven't earned and vou enough to even cover your costs. You have no choice but to get into debt just to cover the basics. Throw in the unpredictability of climate change, drought followed by flooding. You lose a third of your crop and wonder how you can survive. Your children tell you they don't want to be



farmers and are moving off the land. You wonder if it's time for you to leave too. This is what life is like for many farmers around the world. No matter how hard they work they're always at the mercy of the global market.

The fairtrade movement is an outcry against this injustice, a way of guaranteeing basic humanity to the people who grow our food. As well as paying a fair price for the crop it provides a support network for farmers and their communities, giving them the chance to build better lives. It helps them adapt to climate change, to diversify and increase productivity, it gives them a hand when things go wrong.

Isn't this the bare minimum we should give farmers in exchange for the food that keeps us alive, for the treats we enjoy so much? Fairtrade should be our first consideration when we buy, not an added extra. Let's choose the world we want.

Harrogate School of Theology & Mission

Professor Paul Foster, from the School of Divinity at the University of Edinburgh, speaks on 'The Apostolic Fathers: Christianity in the first half of the second century'



During the first and second centuries a group of miscellaneous Christian leaders wrote down their understanding of the meaning of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. They were considered by later Biblical scholars to be the next generation of Apostles and as a result were named The Apostolic Fathers. Their writing contains an essential insight into the development of the early Christian Church and Christian thinking.

This live lecture is at St Mark's Church on Saturday 11^{th} March, starting with a continental breakfast served from 9:30 am, then the lecture from 10:00 am – 12:00 pm. Tickets still cost only £8 per session (students £5 per session and under 18s free) including breakfast and refreshments. Fees are payable on the day by contactless card, cheque (payable to Harrogate School of Theology & Mission) or preferably in advance at <u>Eventbrite</u>.

#Embrace Equity on International Women's Day

Wednesday 8th March is International Women's Day and this year's theme is 'Embrace Equity'. The apostle Paul speaks of a world where there is '*neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus*' (Galatians 3 v 28). Imagine a gender equal world, free of bias, stereotypes, and discrimination. A world that's diverse, equitable, and inclusive; where difference is valued and celebrated.

The English crime writer, Dorothy L Sayers, refused to be identified as a feminist, rather than discriminating between the differences of genders she believed that it is the recognition of our shared humanity as individual human beings upon which equality should be built. In an essay she wrote:


Perhaps it is no wonder that the women were first at the cradle and last at the Cross. They had never known a man like this Man—there had never been such another. A prophet and teacher who never nagged about them, who never flattered or coaxed or patronized; who never made arch jokes about them, never treated them either as 'The women, God help us!' or 'The ladies, God bless them!'; who rebuked without querulousness and praised without condescension; who took their questions and arguments seriously, who never mapped out their sphere for them, never urged them to be 'feminine' or jeered at them for being female; who had no axe to grind and no uneasy male dignity to defend; who took them as he found them and was completely unself-conscious.


