Today is Climate Sunday

Why have we been so deaf to the evidence of climate change and its unfolding consequences, so slow to work out what changes must be implemented to restore balance and so stubborn in avoiding taking the practical micro-actions in our daily lives that would make a difference, however small?

Perhaps the phrase 'inconvenient truth' is revealing. It was used by those engaged in bringing climate change up the international agenda fifteen years ago to challenge the unresponsiveness of governments, industries and individuals. For these mostly carried on with political, business and consumer practices that ignored the evidence - because changing from these did not and does not suit us.



The God we worship is a God of justice who cares for those who suffer as a result of the actions or inaction of others: supremely by sending Jesus as saviour to bring good news to the poor, proclaim release to the captives, let the oppressed go free. Every day of our lives we seek to join with God in this work of doing justice (Micah 6 v 8).

Now the urgent need is to prevent or alleviate the suffering that the poor and disadvantaged are experiencing due to climate change, as it will have the earliest and greatest impact on these people. That's doing justice. So too is anticipating the effects on our children's children and changing the way we meet our needs of the present so as not to compromise the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. Truth and justice are our business as Christians: what steps are you going to take to try and set things right?

It's Education Sunday on 12th September

Education Sunday is a national day of prayer and celebration for everyone involved



in the world of education. The theme for Education Sunday this year will be 'A Word in Season', a phrase taken from Isaiah 50 v 4:


The Lord God has given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him who is weary.

When pupils are struggling, they need help and support not to give up. When pupils are doing well, they need some approbation. A word of encouragement or praise at the right time and from the right person can fire them up to persevere or to do even better. Teachers' encouragement was particularly important during lockdown when pupils spent many hours alone at home with only online contact.

We must express our thanks to the teachers who have gone the extra mile during lockdown. They have supported home-learning online, while continuing to keep schools open, initially for our vulnerable children and children of key workers, and then for pupils in bubbles that were free from Covid. They have had to work harder and been on call for longer, while returning to schools before their turn had come to be vaccinated. Teachers do all this for their pupils, not expecting any gratitude. But they too are weary, and a word of thanks and understanding will go a long way.

After the challenges of the last eighteen months, it is clear that those who teach are as much in need of an encouraging 'word in season' as those who learn from them.
