Anyone seeing a picture of our current Clergy Team might be forgiven for wondering if their eyesight needs checking. How come we have five 'Vicars' for one church – when in most places it is more like one Vicar for five churches?

The answer, like most things, is a complicated combination of factors – some of which are purely practical. For unique reasons we have been allowed to retain The Revd Chris Clayton, as Associate Vicar, for (up to) an additional three years beyond his curacy. The Revd Judith Clark, Associate Priest, received a licence to stay on beyond her curacy as a self-supporting minister while she looked for another post. We were delighted to announce, therefore, that Judith has been appointed as the next Vicar of Clitheroe, starting on 19th November – more details inside. The latest additions to the team are The Revd Karin Shaw and The Revd Steve Gibbin. Karin and Steve are just embarking on the practical phase of their ministry training and so will serve as Curates for the next few years. Our responsibility, during that period, is to support and encourage them as they gain new experience and explore the particularity of God's call in this place. In the meantime, let's enjoy this unusual opportunity to equip and support four clergy who will, in the near or more distant future, be moving on to serve in other situations – almost certainly with fewer clergy!

A new Vicar for the Benefice of Clitheroe, Chatburn and Downham



A part-time Associate Minister takes responsibility for two of the churches. The Bishop of Blackburn will institute, and the Archdeacon of Blackburn will induct Judith on Sunday 19th November 2023 at 7:00 pm at St Mary's Church, Clitheroe. Everyone is invited to attend.

Our Associate Priest, the Revd Dr Judith Clark, has been appointed as the next Vicar of Clitheroe, Chatburn and Downham in Lancashire. There are four churches in the Benefice: St Mary Magdalene's in the market town of Clitheroe (*see picture below*); St Paul's, Low Moor, on the outskirts of the town; St Leonard's in the village of Downham at the foot of Pendle Hill; and Christ Church, Chatburn, a village on the banks of the Ribble.

Wellspring Therapy & Training

Wellspring is a Christian charity working to restore hope, develop resilience and facilitate positive change in the lives of children, adults and young people.

Mental health charity Mind, recognise we are currently facing а mental health catastrophe in the UK. In February 2022 the BBC reported a 77% rise in the number of children and young needing people specialist mental health support.



We echo seeing those trends in our local community with demand for our psychological services increasing dramatically.

'Growing up in North Yorkshire 2022' gathered information from children and young people in the county, reporting that...

- 32% of 12 year olds feel lonely.
- 17% of 15 and 16 year olds have self-harmed and 20% have thought about taking their own life.
- 42% of pupils have regularly made themselves sick, dieted to an extreme degree or done an excessive amount of exercise in order to lose weight.

In 2022, thanks to your donations, we increased the number of weekly sessions we offer to children and adults by 22% to 150 sessions per week. We saw over 400 clients in-house, supported over 300 students and staff in two local high schools, and delivered high quality training courses to over 130 people. You can find out more by downloading <u>our new annual report</u>.

Whilst we have grown, sadly the need for our services continues to grow quicker. Our children's and young people's waiting list is currently closed because we are at capacity. The cost-of-living crisis threatens many charities' support, including ours, making planning for the future challenging. As a charity we rely heavily on donations and are so grateful for the generous supporters we have. In 2022, the average amount we needed to fund was £30 per session. And we offered up to 150 sessions every week! Those costs have already increased this year and the gap we need to fund is increasing.... could you help to bridge the gap?
