70th Anniversary of the Accession of Queen Elizabeth II



Seventy years ago today, Wednesday 1952 February King George VI died and his daughter, the **Princess** Elizabeth, acceded to the throne and became Queen Elizabeth II. is particularly fitting to celebrate this anniversary in 2022 as it marks the beginning of The Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

The Queen is Britain's longest reigning monarch and the first to celebrate their Sapphire and Platinum Jubilees.

Her Majesty as The Queen

is Supreme Governor of the Church of England and also the head of state and we pray frequently for her work and for her needs. All our services today will mark this special anniversary, using the special prayers and readings included in the Book of Common Prayer and Common Worship.

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, bless our Sovereign Lady, Queen Elizabeth, and all who are in authority under her;

that they may order all things in wisdom and equity, righteousness and peace, to the honour and glory of your name and the good of your Church and people; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.
