
## Baby Loss Awareness Week 9<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup>October

Baby Loss Awareness Week is now in its twenty-second year. It gives anyone touched by pregnancy and baby loss a safe and supportive space to share their experiences and feel that they are not alone.

Reflect Harrogate holds its 'Light A Candle' event annually during Baby Loss Awareness Week at St Peter's. On Tuesday  $15^{th}$  October from 12:30-2:00 pm, following the weekly Healing Service, women and families who have experienced miscarriage, baby loss or termination will be able to light a candle in memory of their lost loved one. Trained volunteers from *Reflect* will be on hand to listen and support.

This is a valued space and a now regular partnership between *Reflect* and St Peter's. Clients past and current as well as passersby welcome the opportunity to recognise their loss in a supportive space. *Reflect Harrogate* is celebrating its 10<sup>th</sup> year this October. Over that time it has helped women and couples, mothers and fathers, to find a space to reflect on their grieving process. It will be holding an anniversary event to which all are welcome on the evening of Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> October at Kairos on Harlow Terrace.

Pauline Harrison and Emma Garrow have each been involved with *Reflect* as volunteers for some years and know how valuable clients can find the listening they receive around their loss. ### Thank you for all your Harvest donations





On Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> October St Peter's Church will be holding an envelope collection for this year's *Christian Aid Harvest Appeal*. This year the charity's work in Zimbabwe and how this benefits local farmers like Nyarai Zirugo (*left*) is featured.

Nyarai's determination to provide a secure future for her family led her to take training with Christian Aid's local **Bio-Innovation** Zimbabwe. Through the training, Nyarai learned climate smart agricultural techniques for her to grow a wider range of crops. She learnt how to sustainably harvest many of the wild plants that grow in the hills and forests surrounding her home. With the profits, she has been able to buy goats for the farm, as well as groceries, crockery and blankets.
