Climate of injustice



This is Orbisa, she is 35 and lives in Ethiopia with her children. She and her family work hard rearing goats and cattle to make a living, but in the past few years nine of her ten cows and nearly half of her goats have died. That's because the rains aren't coming as they used to, and droughts in the region are getting more severe. As the climate changes, it's pushing families like Orbisa's deeper into poverty.

In the Bible, Jesus tells us the most important commandments are to love God, and to love our neighbours. Tackling the climate crisis is vital to both of these - honouring God by protecting His creation and loving our global neighbours who are hit first and worst by what is now a climate emergency.

This year is critical, as the UK has hosted both the G7 summit in Cornwall in June and the UN climate talks in Glasgow this month. For the sake of people like Orbisa, this year has to be one when the world leaders respond urgently to climate change.

As Christians our first response may be to lament and pray, but we must also take action. Together we are able to make significant impacts by the choices we make to:

- eat differently food that is local (so it's in season), organic, animal friendly (maybe some meat-free meals each week), fairly traded;
- travel differently walk, cycle, use public transport or an electric or hybrid car;
- vote differently in elections for greener policies; with your money buying from sustainable retail brands; with your voice speaking out about this issue.

We are at a turning point in history, and the decisions we make now will affect our economy, society and the climate for decades to come.


Bell Ringers' Peal Attempt at St Peter's Church

Next week on Remembrance Sunday, 14th November, a band of bell ringers will attempt to ring a half-muffled peal in memory of all those who died in the two World Wars and subsequent conflicts. The attempt, which will be made on the eight bells of St Peter's Church, is being conducted by Barry Dove. It involves ringing around 5,000 different bell



changes, without any interruption or significant mistakes of deviation or hesitation, and takes about three hours of continuous concentration to complete. The bell clappers will be muffled on one side in the traditional manner of ringing for remembrance. Ringing is expected to begin at 12:30 pm and, if all goes well, should finish around 3:30-4:00 pm.
