God's preferred option



When we find ourselves in a seemingly impossible position, we generally spend time searching for options. When totally desperate we might say 'I've tried everything!' or 'I'll try anything!'. So, if God is anything like us, we might expect that Jesus' death and resurrection was God's preferred option. It is hard for us to imagine what could be worse than the suffering of the Cross, and the accompanying agony of Jesus' separation from God. Apparently, however, there was something worse from God's perspective – the prospect of abandoning humanity to live, and to die, with the consequences of our own actions.

So, faced with a choice between giving up on humanity or sacrificing what was most precious in the universe, God chose the latter. And, if that is not remarkable enough, that sacrifice was made without any guarantees. The offer of new life in Christ is only that: an offer. The risk always remains that we, the beneficiaries of that sacrifice, will blindly carry on as if nothing has happened.

The events of the Easter story are a vivid reminder of God's utter, self-giving determination to give us the opportunity for forgiveness and a new start with him. Because of these events, we have, astonishingly, our own choice to make - business-as-usual or new life in Christ. Reflecting on what it looks like when I try to do things my own way, I know my preferred option.

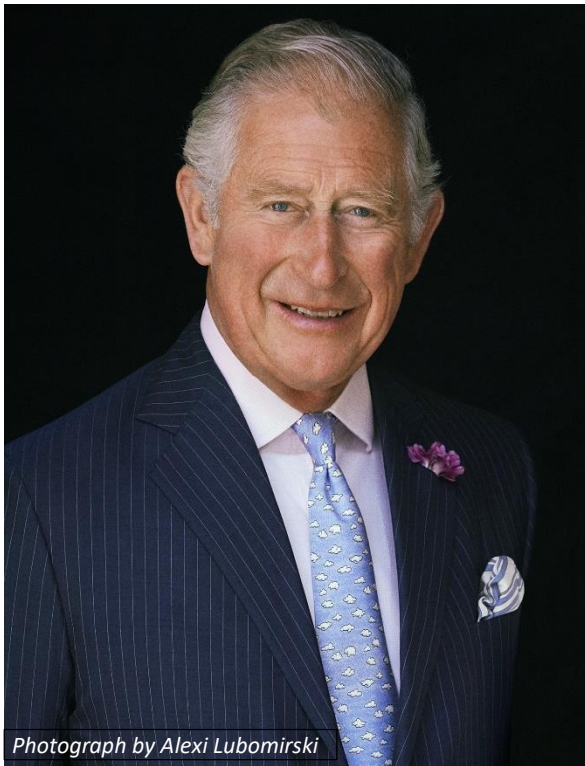

The Church of England's book of *Daily Prayers for the Coronation*

The Church of England is calling for a period of prayer leading up to the Coronation and has released a book of *Daily Prayers for the Coronation of King Charles III*.

Running from today, Easter Day (9th April) for 28 days, up to the day of the Coronation on 6th May, the book provides daily themes, reflections and prayers.

Commending the book of Daily Prayers, the Archbishop of Canterbury and Archbishop of York said, "We are delighted to offer this book to everyone who wishes to join us in praying for The King, The Queen Consort and the Royal Family as they prepare for the Coronation. Looking ahead to this historic moment in the life of our nation, we give thanks for His Majesty The King's example of lifelong public service to others. The Coronation will be a time to celebrate community, faith and service – values that are reflected in these prayers. Please set aside some time each day between Easter and the Coronation to pray with us for Their Majesties, the Royal family and our nation."

The book of prayers combines themed daily readings and shares features of the Coronation Ceremony, exploring the Christian symbolism behind it. The readings also reflect the value that King Charles III places on charitable work, environmentalism, volunteering and community life.

The Daily Prayers are available to order as a booklet from [Church House Publishing](https://www.churchhousepublishing.co.uk/) or copies will be available soon in Church for a donation of £1. They will also be available free via email and audio from the [Church of England website](https://www.churchofengland.org/) and social media.
